GUIDELINES FOR SERVING AS

NATIONAL BOARD MEMBERS

BREED DEVELOPMENT AND CONFORMATION COMMITTEE MEMBERS

When considering your nomination, listed below are some points which you may like to contemplate.

Directors of the Holstein Australia National Board:

- have the full duties and responsibilities of a Company Director under the Corporations Act;
- need to allocate a minimum of 12 days to attend Board Meetings (normally a mix of online or in-person meetings held in Melbourne or a regional location);
- need to allocate time to prepare for meetings as well as any projects with which they are involved;
- are expected to contribute to the Holstein Australia publications from time to time; and
- may be called upon to assist the CEO in specific areas.

Members of the Holstein Australia Breed Development and Conformation Committee:

- need to allocate a minimum of 8 days to attend BDCC Meetings (normally a mix of online or in-person meetings held in Melbourne or a regional location);
- need to allocate time to prepare for meetings as well as any projects with which they are involved;
- may be called upon to assist the CEO in specific areas.

Being a Board or Committee Member of HA does bring with it a workload however it is also a very rewarding experience.
